

ERRATA AND ADDENDA

Page 29: *Atlantic* should read *Western*

*Indian* should read *Eastern*

Page 88: upperwing illustrations are of immature birds.

Page 305: *Yellow-rumped* should read *Yellow-plumed*

Page 265: *Spotted* should read *Western*

*Western* should read *Spotted*

Page 376: Pallas's Leaf Warbler was inadvertently included instead of Pallas's Grasshopper Warbler.

It will probably turn up sooner or later, but shouldn't have been included at this stage.

**Pallas's Grasshopper Warbler** *Locustella certhiola* 13-14 cm

Also known as **Rusty-rumped Warbler**.

Rarely-sighted vagrant inhabiting long grasses and undergrowth. Prominent eyebrow, streaked crown; back rusty-brown with darker streaks; pale tips to wing coverts, tertials and white tip to tail; reddish-brown rump; darkish bar in tail when spread; underparts unstreaked but breast sometimes spotted. *Range*: Rare vagrant from South-east Asia and Indonesia, possible sighting on Christmas Is, likely in rank grasses in Kimberley, Sept-Apr.

(Similar **Lanceolated Warbler** *Locustella lanceolata* 12cm, also possible; obscure eyebrow, browner streaked back and rump, plain tail lacking white tip; breast, flanks and undertail streaked.

*Juv*: less streaked underparts.)

Page 382: A bird tentatively identified as the Forest Wagtail was sighted on Christmas Island after the Field Guide went to press.

**Forest Wagtail** *Dendronanthus indicus* 17 cm

Vagrant wagtail with two prominent black bars on breast; wags tail from side to side, not up and down. Feeds on ground, often takes to trees if disturbed, Nests in trees. *Juv*: less definitely marked but moults before migration. *Voice*: loud "chirrup"; 'seep' in flight. *Range*: Rare vagrant from East Asia and Indonesia to Christmas Is.
